BUSINESS PLAN 2017-18

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INTRODUCTION

The Scottish Road Works Commissioner (SRWC) is an independent regulator of the Roads Authorities and Utility Companies undertaking road works in Scotland.

The role of the SRWC is to provide independent scrutiny of those carrying out road works in Scotland and to promote good practice across the sector.

This Business Plan sets out the Commissioner's objectives, in pursuance of his Corporate Aims (2016-18) for the year 2017-18.

Angus Carmichael was appointed as Scottish Road Works Commissioner in September 2015 for a period of 2 years. This period has since been extended up to 5 years (2020).

This is Angus Carmichael's second formal Business Plan as SRWC.

LEGAL FRAMEWORK

The SRWC is an independent public official established under Section 16 of the Transport (Scotland) Act 2005 and is accountable to the Scottish Ministers and ultimately the Scottish Parliament. The SRWC has powers to appoint staff and has set up a team to assist in the execution of his duties.

The Commissioner has powers to impose financial penalties on roads authorities who systematically fail in their duty to co-ordinate and on utility companies who systematically fail to co-operate when undertaking road works.

The functions of the Commissioner are laid out by the Transport (Scotland) Act 2005 and are as follows:

- Monitoring the carrying out of road works in Scotland;
- Promoting compliance with the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (the Act); and
- Promoting the pursuit of good practice by those persons who have functions conferred on or permissions granted to them by the Act.

The Commissioner is also "the Keeper" of the Scottish Road Works Register (SRWR). The SRWR is a public register which is used for co-ordination of road works in Scotland. The functionality of this register underpins much of the work carried out by the Commissioner.

ACCOUNTABILITY

The Scottish Road Works Commissioner is appointed by the Scottish Ministers and is sponsored by Transport Scotland, an agency of the Scottish Government.

As part of the Commissioner's accountability a Corporate Plan, detailing the strategic outlook for the office of the Scottish Road Works Commissioner, should be prepared. The Commissioner must also lay an annual report and accounts before Parliament.

VISION

The vision of the Scottish Road Works Commissioner is to improve and monitor national performance of road works, creating a positive contribution to Scotland's road network, resulting in minimised disruption for the public.

"TO MINIMISE DISRUPTION TO THE TRAVELLING PUBLIC BY IMPROVING THE CO-ORDINATION OF ROAD WORKS IN SCOTLAND"

At the industry seminar, Roads Expo 2015, the Commissioner set out his methodology to move towards this vision with the identification of clear work streams that his staff would pursue in the coming year. This methodology fits with the overall strategy of the office to contribute to the Scottish National Outcomes set out by the Scottish Government. These were reflected in the SRWC business objectives for the 2016-17 period and are further addressed in this plan.

Further information on the vision of the SRWC and how this supports the Scottish National Outcomes is provided in the SRWC 2016-2018 Corporate Plan.

REVIEW OF THE OFFICE AND FUNCTIONS OF THE SCOTTISH ROAD WORKS COMMISSIONER AND THE COMMISSIONER'S FOCUS FOR 2017-18

At the request of the then Minister for Transport and the Islands, Derek Mackay MSP, a Review of the Office and Functions of The Scottish Road Works Commissioner was requested at the same time as the appointment of the current Commissioner in September 2015. The review was completed in April 2016 and a response by the Scottish Government has been published on the transport Scotland website.

In September 2016, the Scottish Government announced it's programme for Government which included reference to the Scottish road Works Commissioner and road works -

"As part of our preparation for a Transport Bill later in the Parliament, during 2016-17 we will work with roads authorities, utilities, road users and others to develop legislative and other options for enhancing and improving the role of the Scottish Road Works Commissioner and the wider regulation of road works".

Considering the above statement and the results of the independent review, the Scottish Government have been progressing work towards consulting on a new Miscellaneous Transport Bill. The Commissioner and his team have been closely involved with this work and have provided input where required. One member of staff from the Commissioner's team is currently seconded to the Bill team to provide technical input.

The contract for the provision of the Scottish Road Works Register is due for renewal on 1 April 2018 and therefore a great deal of work has been carried out in preparation. Forward planning by the Commissioner with respect to the new register has resulting in the Commissioner's office being in a relatively favourable position at the time of writing with the tender for procurement being issued in March 2017.

Given that the proposed Transport Bill may introduce significant changes to the SRWC regime this business plan does not promote as many policy objectives as would normally be progressed in order to avoid unnecessary work. However, the plan focuses on driving forward technical work steams initiated over the last 12 months, in-depth scrutiny of organisations working on Scotland's roads and the delivery of a new Scottish Road Works Register.

The review of the SRWC's Corporate Plan in 2018 will provide a clear vision for the oSRWC over the remainder of Angus Carmichael's tenure as Commissioner. The plan will be informed by the on going changes to the governance of road works in Scotland, as a result of the new SRWR and any significant changes proposed by any Transport Bill.

SCOTTISH ROAD WORKS COMMISSIONER'S CORPORATE AIMS

The Scottish Road Works Commissioner has 4 overarching corporate aims, set out in the Corporate Plan 2016-2018, to achieve the vision of maintaining high standards of compliance and promoting good practice. This is the second and final year of the current SRWC Corporate Plan.

The aims are as follows:

- 1. To monitor the carrying out of works in roads in Scotland;
- 2. To ensure compliance with road works legislation and the obligations imposed under it;
- 3. To promote good practice; and
- 4. To ensure the effective operation of the Commissioner's office.

This business plan is a working document which acts as a guide for the Commissioner though the financial year. This document details a programme of objectives and activities designed to achieve the strategic aims of the SRWC.
